



AAPC Presents Views on Transatlantic Trade & Investment Partnership at Key Stakeholders Event

WASHINGTON, D.C. – American Automotive Policy Council President Matt Blunt today presented the views of American automakers in support of a free trade agreement between the United States and the European Union at a key stakeholders event on the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (TTIP). Governor Blunt issued this statement following his presentation:

“The American auto industry strongly supports free trade. The Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership has the potential to create one of the world’s largest free market areas and would boost jobs and economic growth on both sides of the Atlantic. Ensuring that the agreement spurs greater auto regulatory convergence is critical to its success and given the magnitude of the combined EU-U.S. market will work against global regulatory fragmentation.
